Classroom FOREST SCHOOL Focus

Year One have been enjoying the Autumn sunshine at Forest School over the past few weeks. As well as hunting for mini beasts, playing on the rope swing and cooking in the mud kitchen they have been busy identifying the species of trees that grow on the field and enjoyed creating their own leaf crowns.

As part of their science learning the children have been using their sense of touch, sight, hearing, smell and taste to explore the field. They completed a scavenger hunt and photographed what they found. They now have plans for making nettle tea and adding more fragrant herbs to our flower beds!

The children have been helping to clear out the raised beds. They are now ready for planting in the spring. We are proud that we have managed to grow a pumpkin! Hopefully it will turn orange in time for Halloween.

Forest meditation has become a regular favourite at Forest School. Taking some quiet time after a busy afternoon to listen to the sounds around us and watch the clouds and birds is a lovely way to relax.


