#### Senior Leadership Message -

As we approach the end of the first half term, it's been wonderful to see so many exciting things happening across Bramley. Staff have been saying how quickly the weeks have flown by, and we're incredibly proud of how well all the children have settled into the new school year.

This week, children in Pre-School, Reception, Year 1, and Year 2 took part in Stagecoach drama workshops, exploring themes such as Being Me, Traditional Fairy Tales, and Musical Theatre. It was a joy to see their learning come to life through expressive and imaginative drama activities.





Year 2 also participated in Restart a Heart Day, a vital initiative aimed at teaching lifesaving CPR and defibrillator skills to children across the South East. The children joined a 30-minute online session led by expert air ambulance doctors and paramedics. With around 25 people experiencing sudden cardiac arrest daily in our region, these skills are truly life changing.

Looking ahead to next week, the final week of this half term, staff will begin planning for our Nativity performances and Christmas events. It may feel early, but we're excited to start preparing for the festive season and will share more details soon.

## Classroom Focus

### **NURSERY**

In Nursery we have had a fantastic half term. 
