### **Guildford Cathedral Art**


Each year Guildford Diocese ask school to create art work to display at Guildford Cathedral. This year's theme was 'Joy to the World'. The children reflected on the meaning of the Christingle and how it symbolises Jesus as the Light of the World. The children take great joy in creating their own Christingle, a tradition that brings our Christian values to life. Our school is rooted in these values, represented by the image of a tree growing from a tiny seed, just like our children, who learn, grow, and flourish in school and at home. As part of this art work, every child created a bird. We chose birds because, in many Bible stories, they represent joy, peace, and God's protection. 
From now onwards we will be in full Christmas mode. Apologies now for all the glitter!


